### REMINDERS

- Pre-registration deadline is **Thursday, January 14, 2010, at 4:30 pm**. Phone call registrations, or those postmarked after Jan. 14 will not be accepted, as the instructors need to know the number of participants in order to purchase and prepare materials.
- Participants may attend four (4) workshops until they are filled to capacity.
- Parents and leaders are invited and encouraged to attend. If you attend with a child to help them out, the adult does not need to register, but please indicate you will be working with your child to allow for adequate seating. When working with your child; remember, this is their learning day, so please refrain from doing the project for them. If the adult will do an activity on their own they must register.
- Registration priority is given to children for workshops filled to capacity.
- Confirmation cards are **not** sent out.
